Converging on the Object: The Courtauld Metal Bag symposium is part of the Research Forum programming at The Courtauld Institute of Art and takes place towards the closing of The Courtauld Gallery's exhibition Court and Craft: A Masterpiece from Northern Iraq, 20 February - 18 May 2014.

The Courtauld metal bag directs our attention to its materiality, the way it was made and the manner in which it connects a historical past to a vibrant visual present. It directs our attention to broad cultural geographies asking us to consider it through diverse scholarly and artistic disciplinary fields. The symposium Converging on the Object: The Courtauld Metal Bag brings together speakers who will reflect on their close study of the object itself and who will consider the evidence of

transcultural thinking in the time and place of the bag's making: the post-Mongol period of the Il-Khanid court culture in the early 14th-century Iran and Iraq. Papers on trade, material culture, food, fashions, art and social habits, belief systems, cultural and political circumstances of patronage are lenses through which we come to reflect on aspects of the cultural lives of the people of Damascus, Mosul, Baghdad and Tabriz — major urban centres during the reign of the Il-khanids and their neighbours in the Eastern Mediterranean — as well as on the links with their Yuan-Mongol contemporaries in China.
